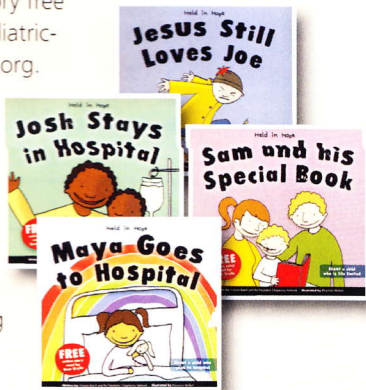

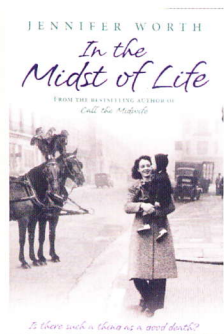
## In the Midst of Life

Jennifer Worth speaks from a nursing background and this account is peppered with anecdotes of her experiences of life and death situations. Some are very poignant, some worrying and some uplifting. She doesn't spare the reader the details of what has to be done for the comfort of the dying. She explores the changes in medical practices that have resulted from the scientific and technological discoveries of the last fifty years, and how the approach to dying from within the medical profession and the general public has altered. Expectations of a longer life are valued without the long term aspects of care considered. She brings to life the arguments sensitively but also with the regret that the advances in science mean that life and death are no longer matters of faith. This is very thought provoking and is understandably important for each of us.



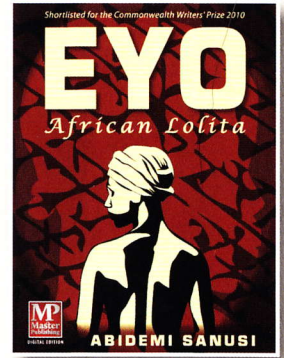

This is a compelling story of ten year girl Eyo, brought up in the slums of Lagos where she very quickly learns how to survive as well as contribute to the family wages. Her father sees her as a possible source of income in London and arranges the passage with the enticement of education. The whole story is harrowing and yet as each stage develops towards the downward spiral into prostitution, there are characters who show her some humanity and love of a sort. Abidemi Sanusi, nominated for the 2010 Commonwealth Writers' Prize, assures us there are thousands of Eyos all over Europe and demands that her readers "Keep an eye out". In the story Eyo is rescued by a priest and nun who think of the streets as their parish. She is returned to her own country but she is a different person to the little girl who was so horribly deceived.

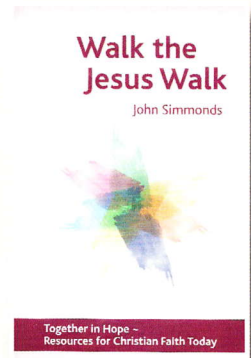
